Smoke or ice sauna in Sahanlahti resort & local gourmet dinner

The Finnish sauna is propably up to 10 000 years old. The prehistoric sauna has com a long way to the modern electric saunas with their high-tec sauna stoves, but the traditional woodheated sauna or smoke sauna are still the most popular options at cottages.

The health benefits of going to sauna have been known for centuries. In sauna, the skin temperature and pulse rise, metabolism speeds up and aching muscles relax. Sauna soothes and makes you feel calm and also improves your sleep. Sauna is pure health!





Sahanlahti is a small, family run resort with hotel and cottage accommodation and two restaurants serving the best of local food made from seasonal ingredients. Both restaurants offer the most amazing lakeside views and the small guest harbour hosts visitors from near and far in the summertime. Built around an old sawmill, Sahanlahti is steeped in history and has a story or two to tell you as you wander around the resort.

Food based on high-quality, fresh and local products and the dedication to ethical and responsible farming are the cornerstones of Sahanlahti dining. All of this and the skill of people growing and preparing your food can be clearly tasted on your plate when dining at the atmospheric Koskivahti restaurant at Sahanlahti.

Your sauna would not be complete without the traditional sauna snack of sausages cooked on the sauna stove. These can be enjoyed on the sauna terrace with refreshments whilst cooling off from the sauna.











Nordic skating in Punkaharju

Nordic skating is an fantastic, safe way to experience the natural ice and enjoy lake Saimaa in winter! There is over a 15 km of skating track network in Punkaharju and it's one of the longest skating tracks in Finland! Track is suitable for for families and beginners, but also long routes for experienced skaters. The track starts from the shore of *Holiday Resort Harjun Portti*, 100m away from the restaurant and equipment rental.

Skating tracks are open usually from late December to end of March. Condition of tracks change depending on weather, see the weekly updated info of tracks open from skating diary.

While visiting Punkaharju, don't forger to visit Finnish forest museum Lusto.

Lusto is the national museum responsible for forest culture and it illustrates the interaction between man and the forest from the past to the future. Lusto's exhibitions, events, work demonstrations and theme days provide a diverse and illustrative insight into the significance of forests in the life of Finns. Lusto is sure to appeal to visitors of all ages.



Wonders of Mechanical Music Museum in Varkaus

Lake Saimaa waterways that extend to the city centre, a lush natural environment and many destinations offer holidaymakers a many opportunities in the Varkaus region. Specialties include the city's own caviar and sturgeon delicacies as well as the home of amazing instruments, the Museum of Mechanical Music.

The number one attraction of Varkaus is the unique Mechanical Music Museum. It is one of the best of its kind in Europe and is mentioned in tourist guidebooks abroad as one of the top ten destinations in Finland. Visitors to the Mechanical Music Museum can take a trip to yesteryear in a funny stand-up

tour. The collection of instruments is unbelievable; music boxes, automatic pianos and orchestras, violins and accordions and hurdy gurdys from small table models to an enormous Amadeus. The grandest of all is the world's largest orchestra, a 75-man Popper Goliath. Every year, the museum personnel restore new devices for the exhibit.

Art Centre Väinölä is an idyllic wooden house in the shadow of birch trees in the centre of Varkaus. In three gallery rooms – White hall – Blue moment – Twilight – there are changing art exhibits throughout the year. Furthermore there is an extensive basic collection of graphics, watercolours and sculptures in the building. Väinölä has professional framing, and a shop that sells artist supplies and posters.

Järvisydän is a vibrant resort with plenty of activities or peace and quiet, whatever you wish to do. Nestled in a bay of Lake Saimaa, the resort offers luxury accommodation, an amazing spa and lots of nature activities. The resort has been run by Heiskanen family since 1658 and is steeped in tradition. You may even spot a curious Saimaa ringed seal here – the rarest seal in the world with a population of only 400.

Järvisydän's Lake Spa will give you a new kind of Finnish lake wellness experience. The spa is built in the middle of the natural rocks and the large windows overlook Lake Saimaa. In the middle of the spa you can find the heart of the lake — a natural pond with the shape of the heart.

The Scenery Suites of Järvisydän are located close to the lake shore of the resort, so you can enjoy the beautiful lake views and the scenery of Linnansaari National Park. In summer you can feel the nightless night through the skylight windows; in Autumn the coming darkness and quietness with autumn colors; in winter the beautiful dark, starry sky and maybe even the Nordic Lights; and in Spring the awakening nature.
